US-Iran Relations: Lost Opportunities?

A round-table discussion with SF State Faculty to mark forty years since the Iranian revolution and the current crisis.



Mohammad Azadpur is Professor of Philosophy at San Francisco State University. His scholarship aims to develop and articulate post-analytic, post-colonial, and cosmopolitan forms of rationalism and humanism. Alongside Islamic philosophers (especially Alfarabi and Avicenna) and their modern critics (e.g., Corbin and Nasr), he draws from and responds to early Heidegger, later Foucault, new Wittgenstein, Kant and Hegel on the sublime, and McDowell. He is the author of *Reason Unbound: On Spiritual Practice in Islamic Peripatetic Philosophy*. He teaches courses on Islamic Philosophy, Islamic Political Philosophy, and Islamic Mysticism.



Maziar Behrooz is an Associate Professor in the SFSU History Department. He received his PhD in History from University of California, Los Angeles. His areas of expertise include the Middle East, Islamic history, and Iran in the 19th century. He teaches a year long course on the History of the Islamic World, 500-present, as well as courses on Iran and Afghanistan. He has published on the Iranian Left and its role in the Iranian Revolution, and the history of Russian-Iranian relations. He is the author of *Rebels With A Cause: The Failure of the Left in Iran* and he often lectures on current events in Iran at public forums.



Mahmood Monshipouri is a Professor of International Relations. He received his Ph.D. from the University of Georgia in 1987. He has taught at the University of Georgia, Central Michigan University, Alma College, Quinnipiac University, Redlands University, and California State University at San Marcos. He teaches several courses in international relations and specializes in human rights, identity construction, and globalization in the Muslim world. His most recent articles have appeared in *Human Rights Quarterly*, *Insight Turkey*, and *International Studies Journal*. He has served as the President of the International Studies Association—Northeast Political Science Association, the Executive Director of the Center for Iranian Research and Analysis. He currently serves as an editor of the *Muslim World Journal of Human Rights*, Berkeley Electronic Press.
